Headhunting was an integral element of religious practices throughout the Papuan Gulf, honouring the spirits (imunu) whose powers sustained the community. Kerewa men formerly lived in communal men-only houses divided into cubicles in which the members of each clan or subclan slept. Each cubicle housed a clan shrine containing one or more agiba and other sacred objects.

The agiba symbolized the vitality and martial prowess of the clan, presiding over the skulls obtained by its members.

The skulls were hung from the agiba by loops of rattan placed over the hook-like projections at the base. At times,

The unit's Hallifaxes dropped supplies to partisans in southern France, Italy and the Balkans. In February Peter Vaughan-Fowler was selected to command a flight of Lysanders to do agent pickup operations to Greece, Yugoslavia and southern France. The unit participated in the Warsaw airlift, where it suffered heavy losses. 148 (SD) Squadron continued its work through the end of the war.

Consigned by direct descendants of Abigail Masham (nee Hill), wife of Samuel Masham. Samuel Masham was the eighth son of Sir Francis Masham, 3rd Baronet, and Mary Scott. He was introduced to the Royal Household as Page, and then Groom of the Bedchamber, to Prince George of Denmark, the husband of the future Queen Anne. In 1701, he was promoted to the position of Equery. He was commissioned a captain in the 2nd Regiment of Foot Guards on 10 January 1704, then promoted to Brigadier General in the Army, and in 1710 became Member of Parliament for Ilchester.

His future wife, Abigail Hill, and he met in the Royal Household circa 1704, when she was appointed Lady of the Bedchamber to Queen Anne. The couple were married some time in 1707, in the presence of the Queen, who contributed £2,000 to Abigail's dowry. She served Queen Anne throughout her Reign, including promotion to Keeper of the Privy Purse in 1711.

The following year, Robert Harley, Earl of Oxfora and Earl Mortimer, requested that the Queen create twelve new Peers to pass negotiations for the Treaty of Utrecht Masham was one of those suggested to the Queen; but she only consented on the condition that Abigail continued to act as her Dresser (a Peeress was not expected to carry out the menial duties of the bedchamber). Abigail agreed, and Samuel became Baron Masham of Otes.

After Queen Anne's death in 1714, Abigail



retired into private life, but Samuel Masham became King's Remembrancer in 1716. He died in 1758, some 24 years after Abigail. In 2018, Abigail's political rise was documented in the film 'The Favourite'.

John Vanderbank was born in London on 9 September 1694, the eldest son of Sarah and John Vanderbank Snr, a naturalised Huguenot immigrant from Paris and proprietor of the Soho Tapestry Manufactory, supplying the Royal Family with tapestries from his premises in Great Queen Street, Covent Garden. John Vanderbank first studied composition and painting under his father, before becoming one of Sir Godfrey Kneller's earliest pupils in 1711 at his Art Academy in Great Queen Street, beside his father's tapestry workshop.

In 1717, upon his father's death Vanderbank received a legacy of £500. In 1720 he cofounded 'The Academy for the Improvement of Painters and Sculptors by drawing from the Naked' at premises in St Martin's Lane. He was made a CVO (Commander of the Royal Victorian Order) in 1935, promoted to KCVO (Knight Commander) on the 2nd June 1943 and later GCVO (Knight/ Grand Cross) on the 16th November 1953.
